With the 2020 election on the horizon, The Federal Communications Law Journal is excited to announce our Spring 2020 Symposium, *Unfettered: Political Speech on the Internet*, featuring a keynote address by Chair Ellen L. Weintraub, Federal Election Commission.

The Symposium will explore lessons from the 2012 and 2016 elections, and insights and best practice addressing misinformation, consumer privacy, and advertisement transparency. It is especially timely to further this discussion today, as social media platforms grapple with increased public scrutiny as it relates to the practices moderating political advertising in advance of the 2020 elections.

The FCLJ invites abstract submissions exploring legislative and regulatory perspectives addressing industry self-regulation, consumer protection or election integrity issues, and existing state or proposed federal legislation.

The usual length of our symposium pieces is somewhere between an essay (5,000 words) and a full-length article (15,000 words); however, there is no set length for our symposium writers, and shorter or longer articles are acceptable. The journal anticipates a deadline for the completed article of May 1, 2020, and publication in the Fall of 2020.
